A young sailor was trying to explain to one of his buddies how he had come to know Christ as his Savior, when his friend broke in to say: "You people always think you're better than others."

"Oh, no," replied the first sailor, "you've got that all wrong. We don't think we're any better than you are—but we're better off."

My dear reader-friend, God loves you and Christ died for your sins 2000 years ago, so that He might offer salvation to you as *a free gift*. Won't you accept this gift? Trust Christ as your Savior and learn the joy of sins forgiven today. It's wonderful to be *saved and safe!*
